Point Three: Schools for the Future

- How will the lunchtime process and resource be adapted to managed the introduction of an additional c.300 people?
- → A systematic review of all procedures is currently underway.
- → New lunch routines will be shared in due course
- → New additional eating point option is confirmed as part of the SFF work
- Where can I access the Curriculum for all key subjects with current and up-to-date topics list?
- → Dedicated section on current school website
- → More to be uploaded in January 2024, including full curriculum maps from Y7 to Y13 (Currently they are from Y9+)
- I would like an update on whether Mr Farmer has spoken to Mr Steer about y7 and 8 options and how viable they are for the new intake next year. I'd like visibility of what residential trips are available to each year group and what is planned for y8 in particular as they would have gone to Belgium round the war graves had they continued at Biggleswade academy. I would like to discuss food provision again, in particular the availability of food if you are at the back of the queue and discuss how this may be fixed. No child should go hungry at lunch time. I'd also like to know from a teaching perspective how you feel you are doing with the y9 behaviour issues.
