Executive Summary

1. Overall Satisfaction:

- **Happy at School**: 82% of parents agree or strongly agree that their child is happy at Stratton School. 8% said they didn't know.
- **Recommendation**: 93% of parents would recommend Stratton School to another parent.

2. School Environment:

- **Safety**: 90% of parents agree or strongly agree that their child feels safe at school. 6% didn't know.
- **High Expectations**: 83% of parents believe the school has high expectations for their child.

3. Communication and Awareness:

- Awareness of Learning: 72% of parents agree or strongly agree that they are aware of what their child is learning and how they are progressing while 8% are unsure
- Response to Concerns: Of the parents who stated they raised a concern, 74% agree or strongly agree that the school responds to concerns raised while 10% remained unsure

4. Behaviour and Bullying:

- **Good Behaviour Promotion**: 87% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school promotes good behaviour.
- **Bullying Response**: 54% stated they have not had any issues with bullying, while 40% of those who have experienced bullying agree or strongly agree that the school responds effectively to bullying. 24% remain unsure. This is an area of immediate action

5. Support and Development:

- SEND Support: 50% of parents who indicated their child has SEND needs agree or strongly agree that the school supports their child with SEND.
 45% were unsure This is an area of immediate action
- **Personal Development**: 78% of parents agree or strongly agree that the school supports their child's wider personal development.

6. Improvements Noticed:

- Parents have noticed improvements in communication, school facilities, and support for children over the past 12 months.
- Enhanced Communication: Parents have noticed better communication between the school and families, making it easier to stay informed about their child's progress and school events.
- Improved School Facilities: There have been upgrades to the school's infrastructure and facilities, providing a better learning environment for students.
- Increased Support for Students: Parents have observed more support for students, particularly in areas such as special educational needs and personal development.
- More Extracurricular Activities: The school has introduced a wider range of extracurricular activities, giving students more opportunities to explore their interests and talents.
- Positive Changes in Teaching Methods: Some parents have noted improvements in teaching methods, which have positively impacted their child's learning experience.

7. Improvements (Summary):

I. Enhanced Communication:

- Continue to improve response times to incoming communications some confusion remains with the move to the new MCAS system. Parents state in the minority that some messages on the app remain unseen, This is an area of action
- Provide clearer information on contacting tutors and staff, especially around information evenings and key school events

II. Support for Students:

- Continue to improve communication on student support for SEND and progress updates, especially on the curriculum coverage and any changes to the planned programme of study.
- Address concerns about students' ability to manage workloads, especially for those with special educational needs linked to multiple homework platforms and revision.

III. Extracurricular Activities:

- Increase the variety and availability of extracurricular activities.
- Continue to invest in new opportunities for students outside of the classroom, such as DOE Silver.

IV. School Environment:

- o Improve the consistency of MCAS/Bromcom use and messaging
- Explore storage solutions for students

V. Academic Options:

- Continue to evaluate curriculum options, with specific reference to MFL choices
- Provide more information about school trips and ensure students don't miss out on opportunities.

VI. Feedback and Reporting:

- Improve the system for tracking and reporting homework. Too many platforms at the moment
- Ensure timely feedback and parents' evenings for all year groups, including sixth form.
- Clear information on how children are progressing and how we assess this.
